

POSTGRADUATE EDUCATION GRANTS 2019 INFORMATION SHEET

Information for applicants for Health Workforce New Zealand (Ministry of Health)

Midwifery Postgraduate Education Grants 2019

Grant applications for midwifery postgraduate education undertaken in the period 1 January 2019 and 31 December 2019 are now invited.

The postgraduate education that will be funded in this application round can consist of midwifery postgraduate papers or Masters or PhD study which is at least at **level eight** as per the New Zealand Qualifications Authority framework. Please see below for additional eligibility criteria. Please note that this **is not** the information for the Postgraduate Complex Care Education Funding. There is a separate application form for this funding which is available on the New Zealand College of Midwives website.

If you are an employed midwife and are intending to apply for postgraduate funding you need to notify your employer of your intention to undertake postgraduate study as soon as possible. This will assist you to negotiate appropriate support from your employer to complete study requirements. (eg. annual leave or professional development leave in order to attend study blocks etc).

Application process

Applications are filled out on-line through the College portal. Please log into the site and follow the Postgraduate Grants Icon to enter a new application. You can apply for Semester One, Semester Two or both.

Please note that Semester Two will not be processed or approved until after 21 June 2019.

All approved papers are included in the application with options available to add other education providers and papers.

Eligibility Criteria

To be eligible to apply for a grant you should:

- ➤ Be planning to complete postgraduate education which is at least at **level eight** as per the New Zealand Qualifications Authority framework in the period 1 January 2019 and 31 December 2019 (Not negotiable).
- Hold a current Annual Practising Certificate with the Midwifery Council of New Zealand with no restrictions which would negatively impact on engaging in postgraduate study (Not negotiable).
- ➤ Be currently working as either an employed midwife (0.4FTE) or as a Lead Maternity Carer midwife working under Section 88 (with an annual caseload of 10 women or more).
- > Have worked as a midwife within the last 12 months.
- ➤ Be a New Zealand citizen or hold a New Zealand permanent residency permit as conferred by the New Zealand Immigration service (Not negotiable).
- ➤ Be planning to undertake the postgraduate education in the period 1 January 2019 and 31 December 2019.
- ➤ Be enrolled in education with one of the following midwifery postgraduate education providers: Wintec, Otago Polytechnic, Victoria University or Auckland University of Technology.
- Not be participating in the Midwifery Complex Care clinical training (another application form is available on the College website for midwives wishing to apply for funding for Complex Care training).
- Not to be a graduate midwife enrolled in the Midwifery First Year of Practice Programme.

Please note that while the first two points in this list are non-negotiable criteria, applications which do not meet the other eligibility criteria listed above can be considered on a case by case basis.

Midwifery applicants who are completing one or two papers in another discipline will be eligible to have their applications considered if these papers are cross creditable towards a midwifery postgraduate qualification. Proof will be required from the education provider that these papers are being undertaken as part of an overall midwifery focused qualification.

Midwives who are undertaking postgraduate study of at least **level eight** (as per the New Zealand Qualifications Authority framework) who do not meet the eligibility criteria or are studying another discipline or topic (eg. Health management or Public health) are encouraged to contact the College to discuss whether they may be eligible for a grant.

Midwives who have been granted funding from another source towards the cost of postgraduate education study that they are applying for HWNZ funding (for example, from their employer), need to declare the nature and amount of funding or support received. Any funding support received will have to be deducted from any HWNZ grant entitlement.

New Zealand College of Midwives are disbursing a finite postgraduate budget, therefore cannot guarantee that all applicants will receive funding.

Midwifery Postgraduate Education Grant entitlements

Where budget allows, education provider fees are fully funded by the Grant. If applications exceed available budget, Grants will be disbursed according to the priorities of the HWNZ contract. You may be eligible for additional travel and accommodation costs. Please refer to the Grant categories below to determine which you can apply for. Applicants must identify the appropriate Grant category for each semester. Grant funds must only be used for the cost of student fees, and for travel and accommodation expenses (excluding meals).

Travel Grant Categories

<u>Travel Category A</u> is a \$250.00 grant per Semester and is for midwives who live more than 50km one way from the education provider but not needing to pay for accommodation.

<u>Travel Category B</u> is a \$750.00 grant per Semester and is for midwives who live more than 50km one way from the education provider and will be required to travel and pay for accommodation for at least 2 nights away from home for required attendance at face to face study blocks.

<u>Travel Category C</u> is a \$1,000.00 grant per Semester and is for midwives who live more than 50km one way from the education provider and will be required to travel and pay for accommodation for 3 or more nights away from home for required attendance at face to face study blocks.

Travel Grant amounts are paid per Semester. If you are eligible for funds to support travel the total grant amount, including fee costs will be paid directly to you. You will need to arrange payment to the education provider for your fees. The grants are exempt from GST.

Grant payment arrangements

The College is intending to disburse grants directly to education providers as payment for fees for eligible midwives who are enrolled in postgraduate study with either AUT, Victoria University, Otago Polytechnic, Wintec or the University of Otago. In order for this to occur we need your permission (as per signed declaration in the Application form) to do this. In some cases:

- applicants will be eligible for additional travel and accommodation assistance over and above the cost of fees
- the timeframe for the education provider to receive fees to confirm a place in the postgraduate course is prior to the funds being available from HWNZ
- midwives will be enrolled with an education provider for whom the College does not have an arrangement to pay fees on behalf of midwives (eg. University of Canterbury)

In the above circumstances the College will need to disburse the entire Grant directly to midwives. We will contact you to discuss payment arrangements. Please provide bank account details if you are anticipating you will be receiving funds directly from New Zealand College of Midwives.

Application and funding disbursement timeline

As some midwives will be commencing study part way through each Semester (in particular those who are enrolling in papers which are commencing in May or September 2019, or enrolling in Masters of PhD programmes which may commence at varying times during the year), there will be two funding disbursements for each Semester. Please see the table on page 4.

As New Zealand College of Midwives is disbursing a finite budget eligible applications will be prioritised on a first come basis, ie. midwives who have their completed applications to the College by the first deadline will have a higher likelihood of being successful in receiving funding.

You are welcome to apply for your full year's funding in Semester One but payments will not be confirmed until Semester Two and confirmation will be sought that your education is continuing as planned. Key dates are included at the end of this document.
